Tribute to an Educator

Active teaching and counseling, co-operation, and friendliness, as well as great leniency and understanding, are a few of many qualities that will long be remembered by the Class of '64, which is sincerely proud to dedicate our yearbook to you, Mr. Ivan K. Fleser.

Born in Burnips, Michigan, Mr. Fleser was the fifth child in a family of eight children. Upon graduation from Hudsonville High School, winning letters in football and baseball, college was temporarily interrupted by military service. He served in the Naval Air Corps, receiving his Wings in 1944 at Pensacola, Florida. During World War II he bravely withstood the elements of war as a navigator on a B-24 in the Pacific. He was honorably discharged as a full lieutenant.

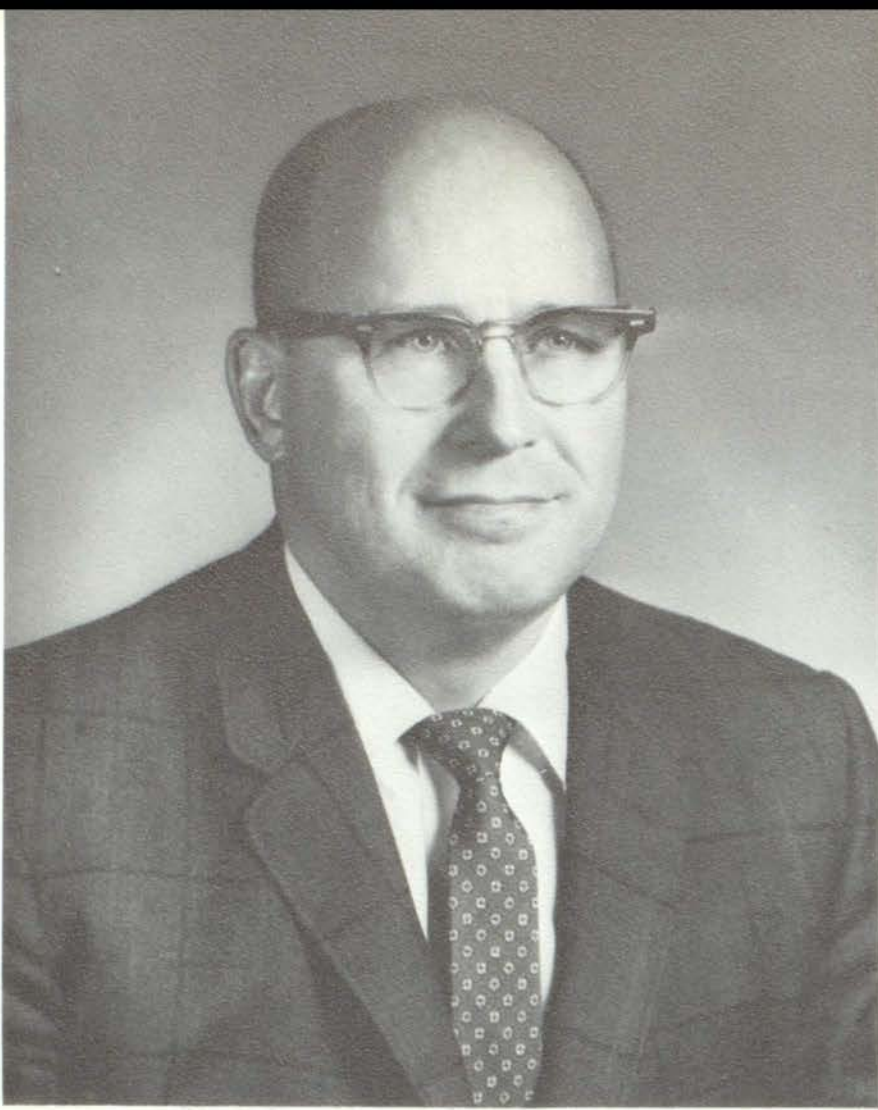
After returning home, Mr. Fleser earned his B.A. degree at Western Michigan University, then a master of arts from the University of Michigan. While attending Western, he held many athletic achievements: representation of the Midwest in the College All-Star Game at Fenway Park in Boston; after graduation, assisted Western's baseball coach, Charley Maher; and also contributed heavily to the baseball team's record-setting 18 consecutive wins. He had the opportunity to play baseball with Ted Williams on a service team while training for his Navy Wings.

Mr. Fleser's 15-year teaching career began at Albion where he taught civics and world history for three years, plus coaching baseball.

Coming to Marshall in the fall of 1951, he married, and began teaching classes in high-school geography, and eighth-grade geography, American history, and Michigan government. Also, he has coached baseball during his 12 years here. Currently he is our guidance counselor, teaches basic living, and coaches baseball.

A member of the Burnips Methodist Church, Mr. Fleser and his wife (the former Betty Jane Kraushaar) have one daughter, nine-year-old Deborah.

We, thank you, Mr. Fleser, for all the guidance and advice you have given us during the course of our high-school years.

Administration and Curriculum provide . . .

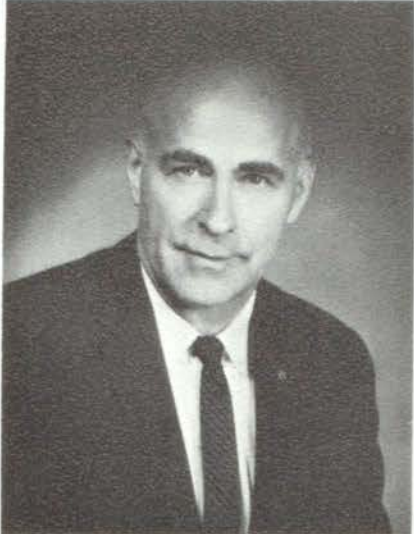

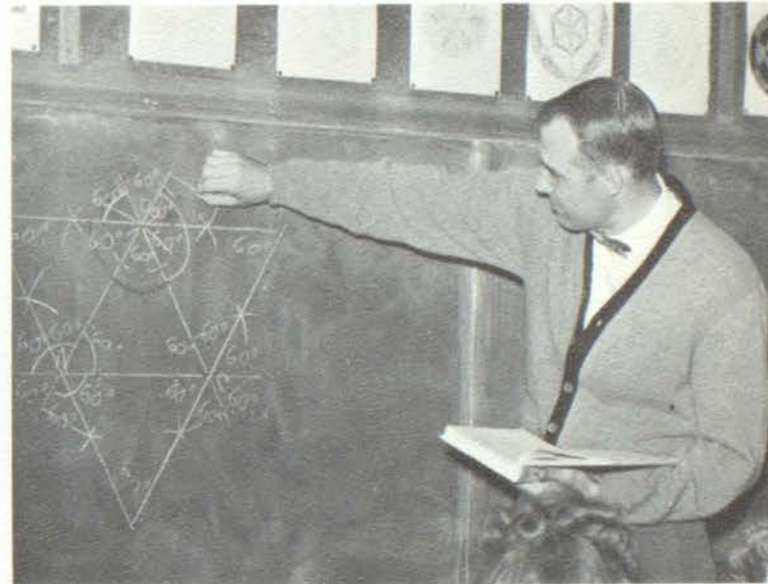

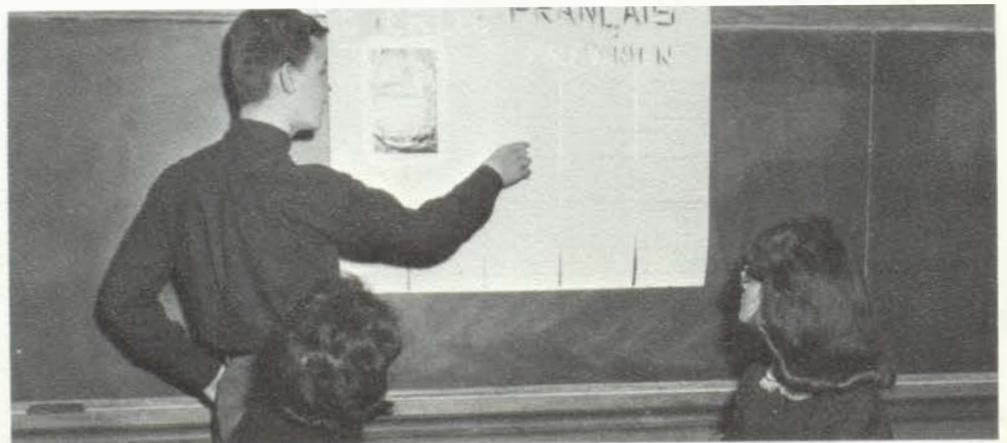

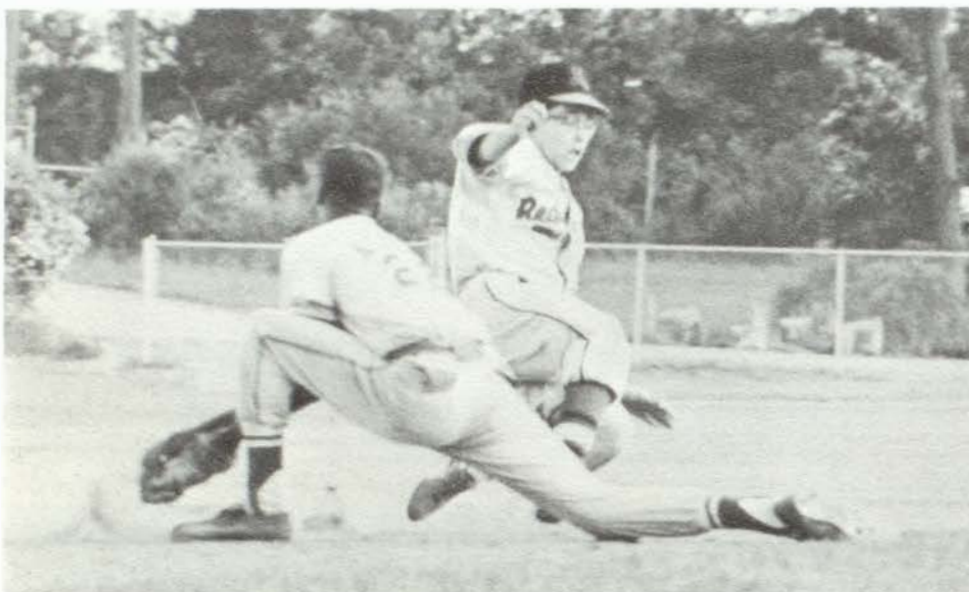
sportsmanship within . . .

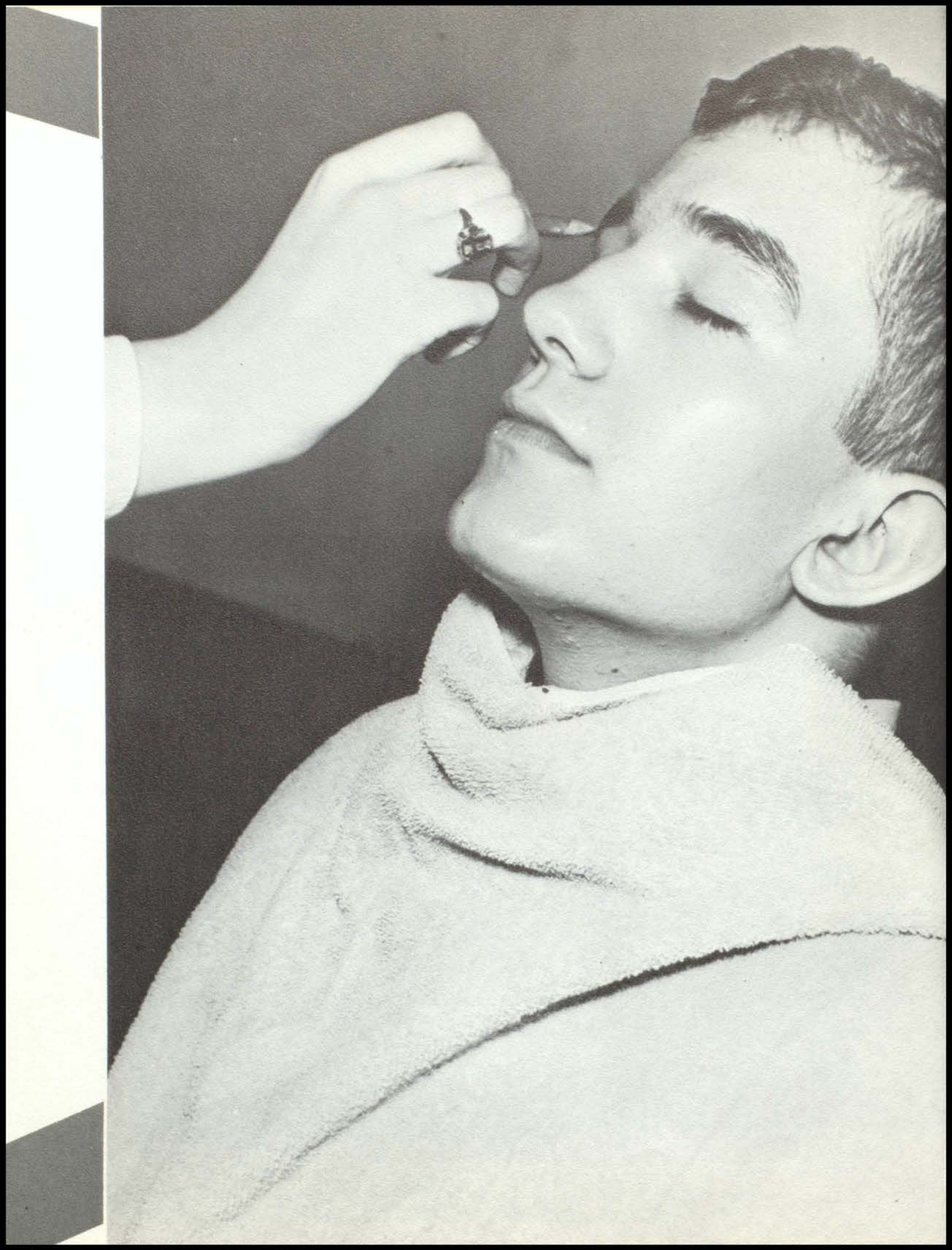
