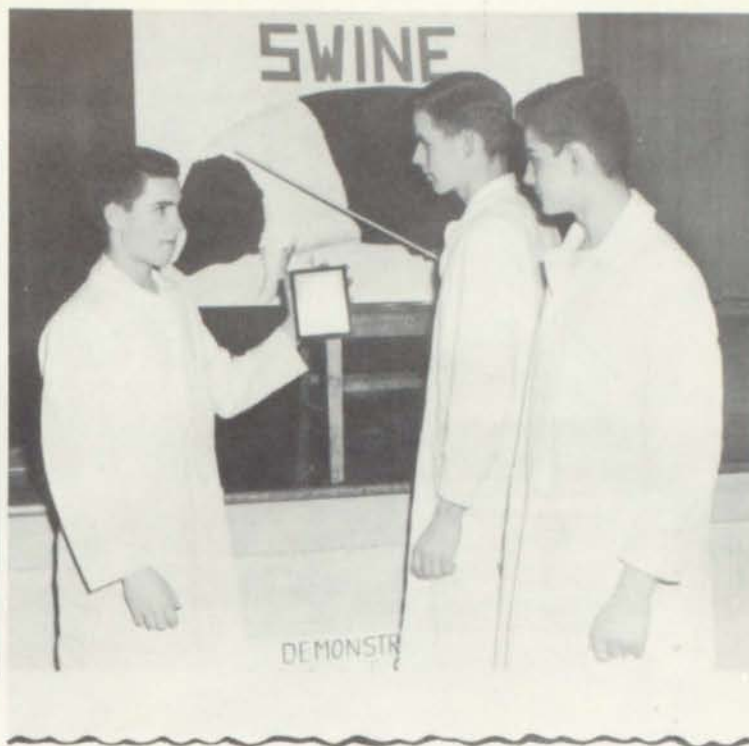
BIOLOGY club

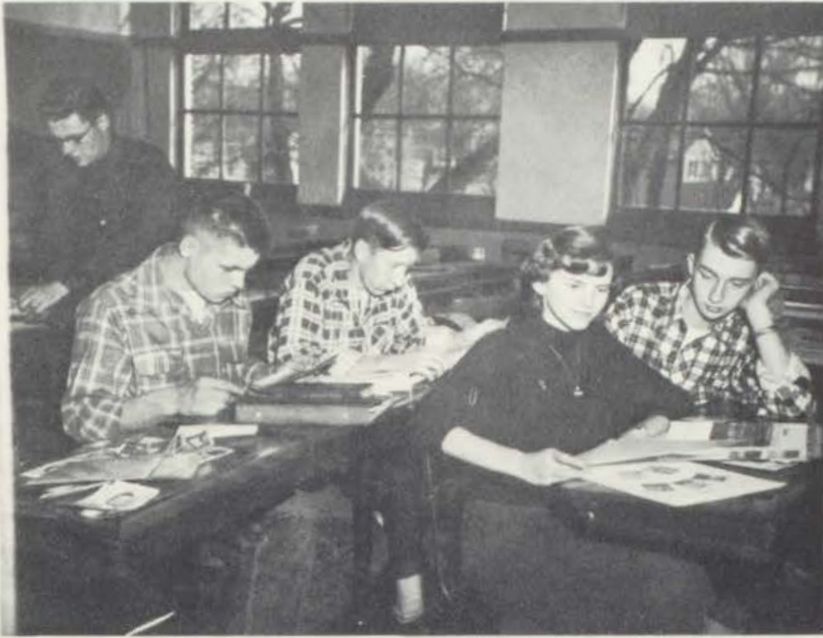

The affirmative team consists of Dick Humphrey, Peggy Baird, and Don Zinn who alternated during the course of the year.

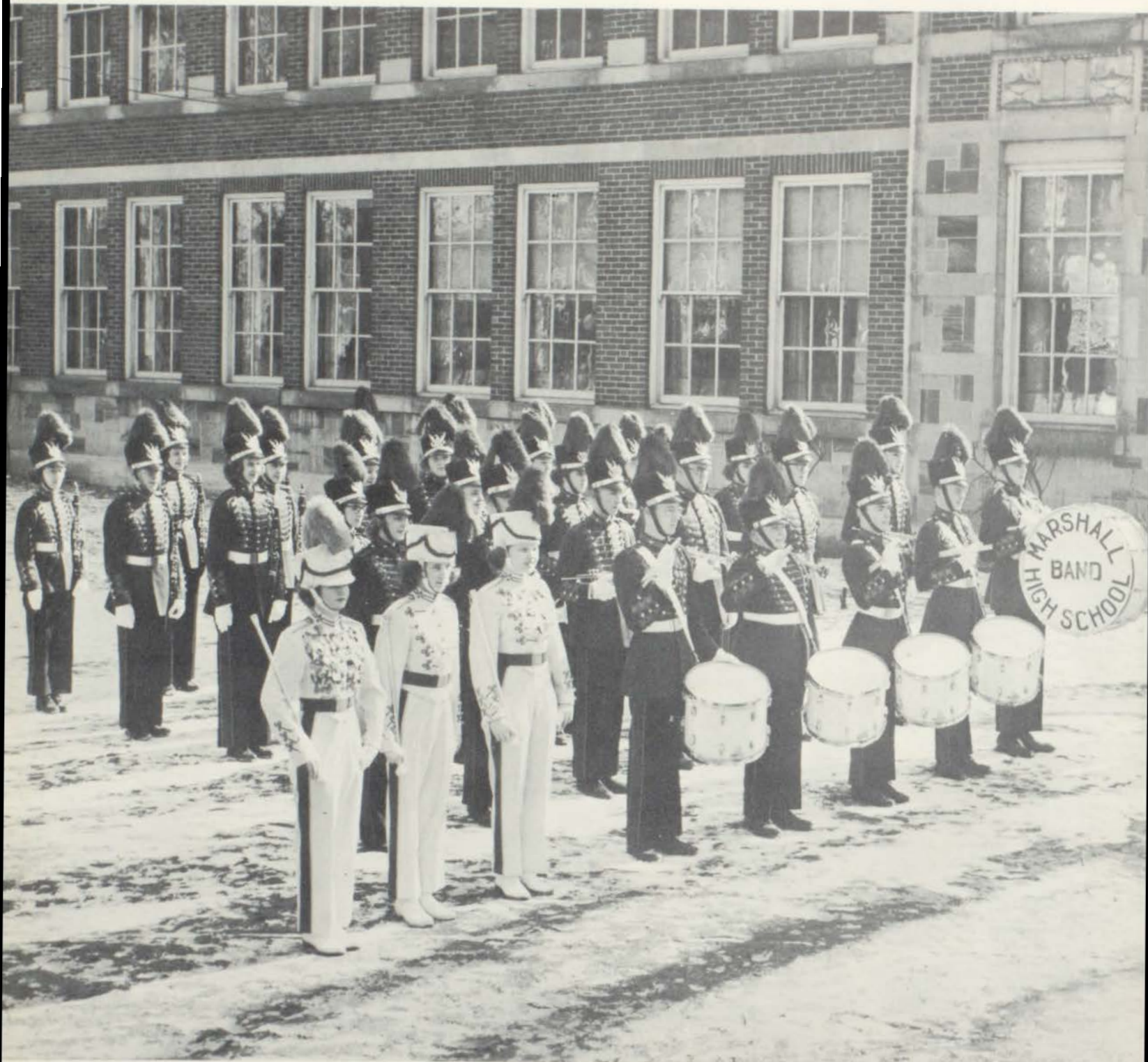

JOHN HETZ

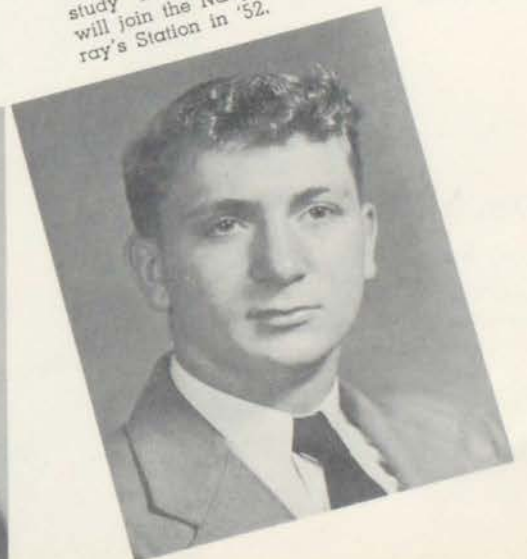
