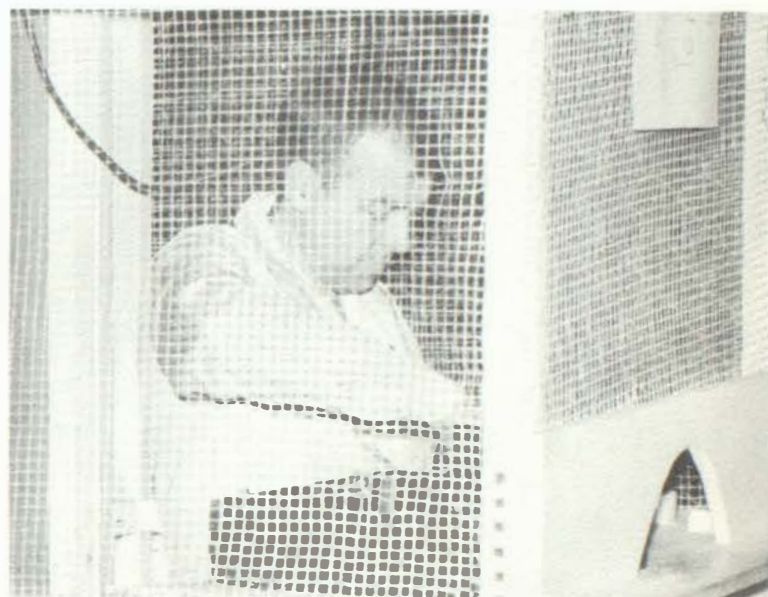
Mr. Cairns was born in Kalamazoo, Michigan, where he made his home until he began teaching. Upon graduating from high school, he enrolled at Western Michigan University. At the end of his sophomore year, Mr. Cairns enlisted in the Aviation Cadets, graduating as a bombardier. During the remainder of World War II, he served as a member of a bomber crew in Europe. Following the war, Mr. Cairns married and returned to Western Michigan University, where he graduated in June, 1949, with an A.B. degree. A daughter, Sue, was born to them in 1947.

Mr. Cairns' teaching career began at Mason, Michigan, in 1949, where he taught general science, chemistry, and physics for the next seven years. While living in Mason, a son, David, was born, increasing their family to four.

In 1956 Mr. Cairns came to the Marshall Public Schools where he began teaching classes much the same as those in Mason. As the high school enrollment increased, it was necessary for him to drop the general science course. This year, Mr. Cairns has taken on the added responsibility of teaching a newly-formed advanced science and mathematics course.

As the result of summer sessions, Saturday and evening classes at Western Michigan University, Mr. Cairns secured his master of arts degree in the teaching of mathematics and science in June, 1961.

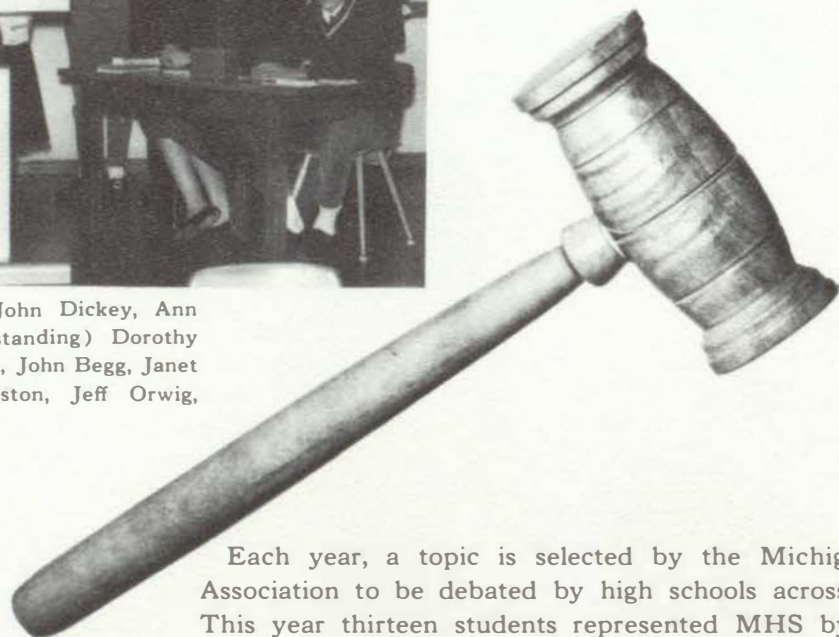
