## Swimming in a Sea of Knowledge

Redskin Students Dive into the Computers and Put Their Smarts to the Test.

The Knowledge Master Open is a program which tests the skills and intelligence of students. Not only do they compete statewide, but they also compete nationwide. A team of 14 Marshall High students scored 1,176 of 2,000 possible points. This score placed the team 16th in the state out of 26 teams, and 573 out of 1,026 teams nationwide.

On December 6th, in the 35th Knowledge Master Open, thousands of students in middle school, junior high, and high school, even from other countries, faced their computers and answered 200 tough questions to vie for top scores based on the accuracy and speed of their answers.

Results of the contest are tabulated into overall, state, and enrollment-size ranking. "It was fun to compete, but getting out of class was the real bonus," junior Jared Palmer said.

## COLOPHON

The 2001 Marshall High School Yearbook, The Dial. is 244 pages in length. with one full signature of color plus one color tip in. The theme and cover concept were developed by Nick Zalewski. The cover idea was then implemented by Jostens Cover Art Department. The yearbook is 9 hy 11 inches in size. The printing cost of the yearbook is $\$ 32,000$, with around $\$ 6,000$ of this coming from advertisements. The yearbook was in severe debt from several years before 1999. About 546 copies of the yearbook were sold at an initial price of \$40 each.

Beth Weare and Molly Miller headed up the yeatbook staff as co-editors. Nick Zalewski was in charge of ad management. Jennifer Henry compiled the index with help from Jennifer Litton. The yearbook staff was overseen by Mrs. Diane Long as the yearbook Advisor.

The student sections were designed by Beth Weare and Molly Miller. Nick Zalewski designed the ad sections, and Jema Berry designed the index sections.
This was the first year of incorporating digital design. The computers and other hardware were funded by gramts from The Marshall Community Foundation. The Gromin Foundation, and a Mawby Grant. The software used were Adobe Photoshop 5.5 and 5.0 LE, and Adobe Pagemaker 6.5. We had two traditional EOS Rebel cameras, and two digital Fuji 2700 zoom and one Fuji 4700 zoom.

Underclass photos and team photos were taken by Prater studios, Senior portrails were taken by a wide variety of photographers. Body copy was set in 10 point Palatino, and captions were 8 point Helvetica. Special
