The members of this club planned and prepared suppers, teas, and the big event of the year was the F.H.A. banquet.

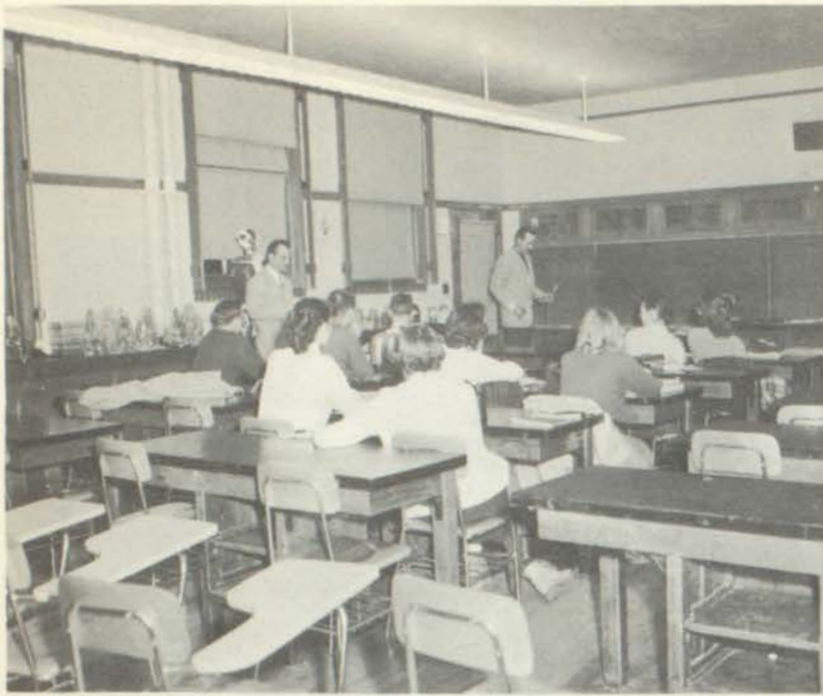

To join the FFA one must take vocational agriculture and have at least one earning project. All boys wishing to be initiated must be accepted 100 per cent by their fellow members.





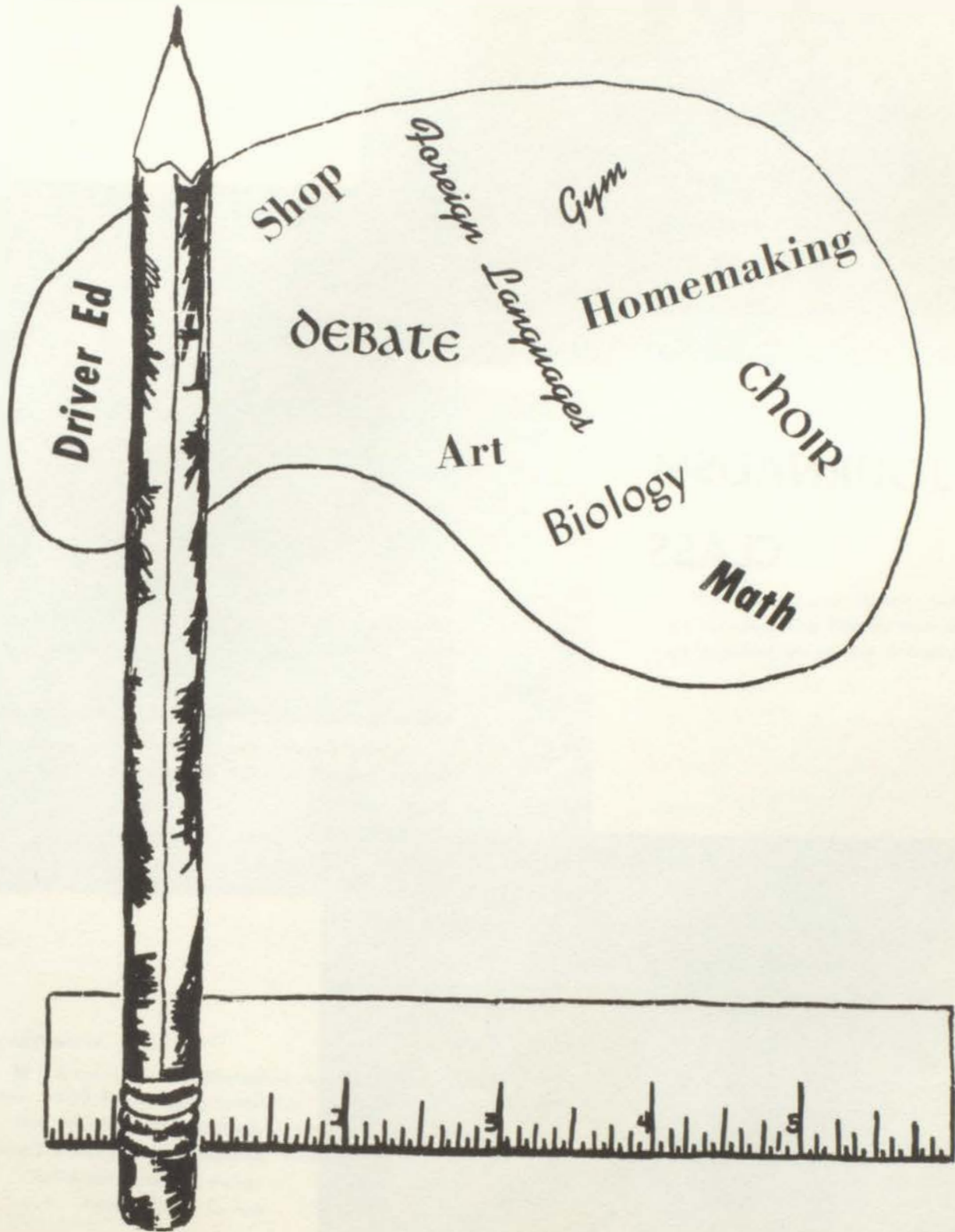
Science Club
