Welcome to our fifth annual Happy Camp program. Happiness can look very different to different people & for the last few years, the library has spent some time during the gray days of winter exploring things that can bring people joy.

For those who are not aware, one of the popular services that the library offers our community is historical & genealogical research assistance. We have a variety of print materials in the library including City & County directories from 1860, yearbooks starting from 1899, county atlases & plat maps, family histories, church records, & cemetery record indexes. We have also spent the last twelve years working towards digitizing much of this material including making digital copies of newspapers from 1838 to present available through our website at www.yourmdl.org.

This year we are particularly happy & grateful that we are going to be able to bring to life the long-time dream of building a Local History Room in the library thanks to the generosity of Laura R. (Withee) Bliss, who passed away in September of 2023. This Local History Center will be built in the northeast corner of our building, taking the place of a storage room & shifting a portion of our adult-nonfiction collection. This area will include shelving for local history materials, comfortable furnishings, research computers, a binding machine, & digitization equipment for books, photos, slides, & various forms of media. We look forward to working with local individuals & organizations to help them digitize & make available their unique historical treasures. While we don't have the date for construction at this time, the library has been going through a bidding process. According to Laura's family, Laura's love of reading & libraries started early on due to the encouragement from her mother, Eleanor M. (Rushford) Withee, a former Marshall Public Library employee in the 1930s, & her father, Alton B. Withee. She was a faithful supporter & patron of Marshall District Library all her life.

Upon retirement as a purchasing manager at Denso in Battle Creek, Laura devoted much of her free time to her lifelong passion: conducting genealogical research on behalf of her family & friends. We are grateful that she provided the funding through the Laura R. Bliss Trust for the development & enhancement of an MDL Local History Center which will be enjoyed for generations to come.
